

ALFRISTON DAY CENTRE AND BEFRIENDING SERVICE. A COMMUNITY HUB FOR OLDER PEOPLE



Alfriston Day Centre is a vibrant, caring place for older people to enjoy social interaction. Outings and activities with transport are available if required on the Alfriston minibus. The Day Centre is open from 9.30am each day. On arrival, tea and coffee is served and there is an opportunity to socialise before lunch. We serve a tasty home-cooked two course meal which is followed by stimulating afternoon entertainment, which may include musical entertainment, quizzes and reminiscence discussions. Hairdressing services are available every day in our salon, as well as frequent chiropody and manicure services. We also supply hearing aid batteries. Our outings are very popular and include theatre visits, day trips on the river and to the seaside. These are open to users and non-users of Alfriston Day Centre.

Our free Outreach Befriending Service links friendly trained volunteers with older people in the community who are feeling isolated or lonely, and are unable to attend the Day Centre. Volunteers make regular visits to provide companionship and social interaction.
