OUTREACH BEFRIENDING SERVICE

Our free befriending service celebrated its 6th
anniversary in January. The service has grown over the years from a small pilot scheme into one that is recognised by health professionals and Adult Social Services. It is aimed at older people in our community who are unable to attend the Day Centre and who may be feeling isolated at home. Our friendly trained volunteers visit the person in their own home to provide them with companionship on a regular basis.

We had a Volunteers Lunch at the Day Centre in January and it was wonderful to see everybody and thank them for the marvellous work they do in reducing social isolation in our Community.
